The Clerk reported that she had spoken to Mr Hackney at the Environmental Health Services Department of the District Council. The District Council are willing to move the bins and meet the cost of this but require the Parish Council to suggest an alternative site.

Cllr Sharpe suggested that the bins could be moved to her property. A fence on her land would need to be removed by the District Council to allow access to the bins and this fence would need to be replaced by the District Council if the bins were moved again in the future. District Council to be asked to contact Cllr Sharpe about this. **ACTION: A Keeley**

Cllr Matthews thanked Cllr Sharpe for her offer which means that the village will not loose this facility.

j) Parish Council Contributions from Bassetlaw District Council

Cllr Atkinson reported that he and Cllr Matthews had attended the Parish Councils Liason Group Special Meeting on the 22nd January at Worksop Town Hall. The meeting was held to discuss proposed budget cuts and the possible removal in two stages of the Contributions System to Parish Councils.

The Parish Council discussed the options available and decided to explore the possibility of changing boundaries to be included in the Newark and Sherwood area rather than Bassetlaw.

General Displeasure was expressed about the proposals of Bassetlaw District Council.

Clir Sharpe reported that she had attended a meeting at Rampton Village Hall on 6th January 2003 about the possibility of acquiring a defibrillator to cover Rampton and surrounding villages. She reported that this would be very useful for the area as in many medical emergencies the first eight minutes are crucial and ambulance response times to rural villages are longer than this. Volunteers would be needed to operate a Community Responder Team — they would be fully trained and supported and would work in pairs. The Parish Council decided to have discussions with surrounding Parish Councils to see if they would be interested in joining in with this and therefore sharing the cost. **ACTION:** Clir Matthews

Matters Arising

a) Accidents

It was reported that two accidents had happened recently. One outside the Old Police House and one at the junction near the Village Hall. Both accidents involved cars colliding.

b) Criminal Acts

It was reported that a car had been taken from Ragnall.

c) Highways - A57

The Clerk was asked if she could find out what the road works were for which were currently being carried out on the A57. The side of the road is being dug up on the A57 just before the turn off to East Drayton. ACTION: A Keeley

- d) Highways Parish
 - In March the Parish Council wrote to the County Council to ask when the procedure for introducing the new speed limit on Laneham Road would begin. A reply has now been received which says that it will be reported to the next meeting of the Transportation Consultative group on the 16th July. If the proposals are supported by the Group the Traffic Regulation Order process will take a minimum of nine months to complete from that date. After discussion it was decided to write to the County Council again to see if this process could possibly be speeded up. ACTION: A Keeley

Cllr Barden said that the Parish Councillors will need to decide what they are aiming to get out of the appraisal and how to analyse the material. Cllr James suggested that the forms could be looked at during the next meeting to see what is involved and then decide how to proceed with analysing the material.

i) Cllr Sharpe reported that she had just attended a meeting at the School

about heating. Wood burning boilers are to be put into 6 sites in Nottinghamshire and Dunham School has been selected as one of the 6 sites. The boilers will be installed free of charge and the School would just need to pay for the wood. Maintenance will cost £250.00 per year and £700.00 every fifth year. The School's current boiler needs to be replaced and a new one would cost £16-17,000.00. The wood burning boiler is very environmentally friendly. These 6 boilers would be the first to be installed in this country. The School needs to make an immediate decision on whether to go ahead with the wood burning boiler. After discussion it was decided to tell the School that on the face of it the wood burning boiler seems to be a good idea although some Councillors had some reservations due to the newness of the scheme. Cllr Sharpe to report back to the School. ACTION: Cllr Sharpe ii) Concern was expressed about the possible construction of an incinerator at Woodcoates Lane. After discussion it was decided to try to obtain further details about this. The site is thought to be in the area of Normanton Parish Council and the Clerk was asked to contact the Clerk at Normanton to see if she has any further details. ACTION: A Keeley iii) It was reported that there had been some problems with youths at the Darlton play area. Cllr Lyon said that PC Waters had been involved and that the matter was hopefully now resolved. She said that she was hoping to

arrange an official opening for the play area and asked if anyone had any suggestions who should be asked to open it. It was suggested that the funders could be asked if they are available to do the opening and Cllr Lyon is to contact them to see if they are willing to do this. ACTION:

Clir Lyon. Clir Barden suggested that if the funders are not able to do the opening Cllr Lyon and Cllr Cobb could open the play area themselves as they have done so much work in getting the play area up and running.
